### **Instructions for Taking**

## Over-the-counter Pain Medications

If you can safely take NSAID medications, the combinations below work 30% better at controlling pain than narcotic pain medicines. To maximize your comfort before and after your procedure, Dr. Moorhead recommends this regimen for your dental pain:

#### **Alternative 1:**

Medication	Your Weight	Your Dosage
Aleve (Naproxen Sodium)	120+ lbs.	2 tabs every 8 hours
	90 – 119 lbs.	1.5 tabs every 8 hours
<u>PLUS</u>		·
Tylenol (Acetaminophen)	120+ lbs.	2 extra strength every 8 hours
-	90 – 119 lbs.	2 regular strength every 8 hours

Note: You can continue this dosage as often as every 8 hours for <u>only 5 days</u>. After, take Naproxen Sodium only every 12 hours or use Alternative 2 below.

#### **Alternative 2:**

Medication	Your Weight	Your Dosage
Advil (Ibuprofen)	110+ lbs.	3 tabs every 6 hours (200 mg. each)
-	90 - 109  lbs.	2 tabs every 6 hours
<u>PLUS</u>		·
Tylenol (Acetaminophen)	120+ lbs.	2 extra strength every 8 hours
	90 - 119  lbs.	2 regular strength every 8 hours

# If your procedure is scheduled, take these doses one hour before: Alternative 1:

Medication	Your Weight	Your Dosage
Aleve (Naproxen Sodium)	120+ lbs.	2 tabs
	90 - 119 lbs.	1.5 tabs

#### **Alternative 2:**

Medication	Your Weight	Your Dosage
Advil (Ibuprofen)	110+ lbs.	3 tabs (200 mg each)
	90 – 109 lbs.	2 tabs (200 mg each)

If Dr. Moorhead has prescribed the narcotic Hydrocodone or Percocet, <u>do not take Tylenol</u> with either of these medications, since those medicines already contain Tylenol.
